Our aim is to grow and supply high quality, local provenance trees from seed collected from the remaining woodlands in Northern Ireland

Why is seed provenance important for native and naturalised* trees and shrubs?

Northern Ireland's native trees and shrubs have been growing here since the end of the last ice age. During those last 12,000 years or so, they have become well adapted to their local environment, e.g. climate and soil conditions. Seed collected from these trees is recognised to produce more suitable specimens for planting back into Northern Ireland than seed of other provenances, which may be adapted to very different conditions.

The benefits of using plants from locally collected seed may include:

Improved growth Trees of local provenance have been shown to demonstrate higher growth rates in local plantings than imported stock.

Higher survival rates Trees of local provenance will be best suited to the planting site and should ensure higher survival rates.

Protection of wildlife and enhancement of the landscape The onset of flushing (bud burst) and ripening of fruit varies depending on the timing of the seasons. Imported trees will come into leaf and fruit at different times than local stock, upsetting the fine balance between native trees and the wildlife they support.

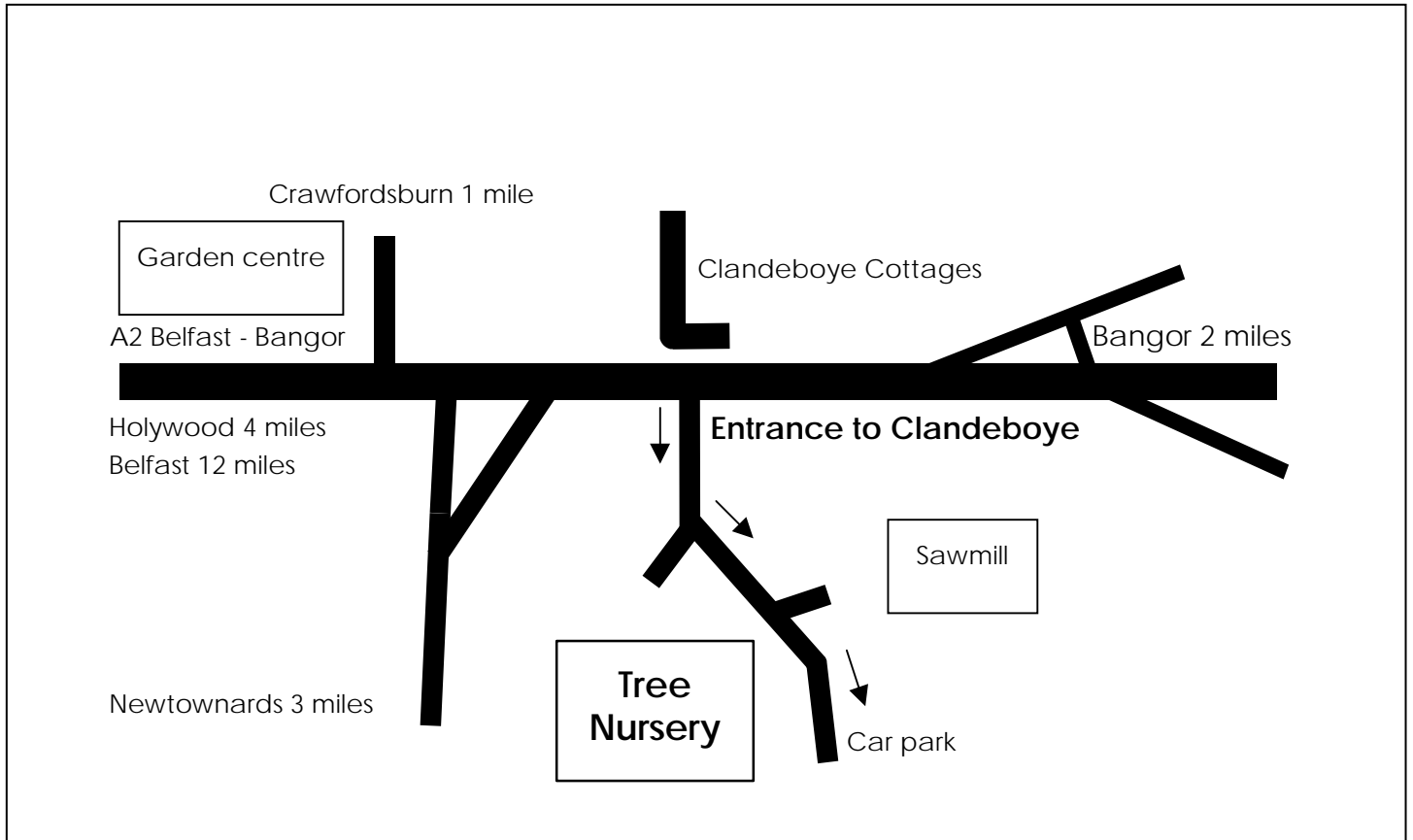
Retention of 'genetic pools' Thousands of years of adaptation have resulted in our native trees becoming well adapted to local conditions. These characteristics form a 'gene pool', which could be lost forever through cross-pollination with imported trees.

** Naturalised trees and shrubs have been introduced by people, but now grow wild in Northern Ireland. Seed collected from parent plants that have adapted over time to the local conditions will demonstrate similar improved growth and survival rates as native trees and shrubs.*

All trees are supplied bare-rooted unless otherwise indicated
